



### A Different Chamber

Chamber San Mateo County is not your traditional chamber of commerce. Focused more on 'getting things done' and less on talking about getting things done, Chamber San Mateo County is a convener of all facets of the community to tackle big problems and make a lasting impact on issues that matter – transportation, housing and taxes. We are the voice and support for business, institutions, employees and labor for growth, problem solving and the bettering of the region's quality of life.

# **A New Footprint**

In 2023, the Belmont Chamber of Commerce and Menlo Park Chamber of Commerce successfully transitioned their memberships to Chamber San Mateo County. These two chambers join the San Carlos Chamber of Commerce, which transitioned its membership to the Redwood City-San Mateo County Chamber in October 2020, creating Chamber San Mateo County. With this new footprint, Chamber San Mateo County serves more than 1,500 businesses in four cities and throughout the county.





### A New Name

We chose to re-brand from the Redwood City Chamber of Commerce to Chamber San Mateo County after the successful transition of the San Carlos Chamber. This new geographical area is the largest of any chamber in San Mateo County and includes the county seat and encompasses 175,000 residents and 100,000 employees.

# **Increased Potential for Impact**

With this new reach, Chamber San Mateo County represents parts of two congressional districts, one state senate district, two Assembly districts, three county supervisor districts, four cities, and seven educational districts, with nearly 65 elected officials, in addition to professional staffs at each governing body. This vast network increases Chamber San Mateo County's ability to advocate for our members on a larger, regional scale.




